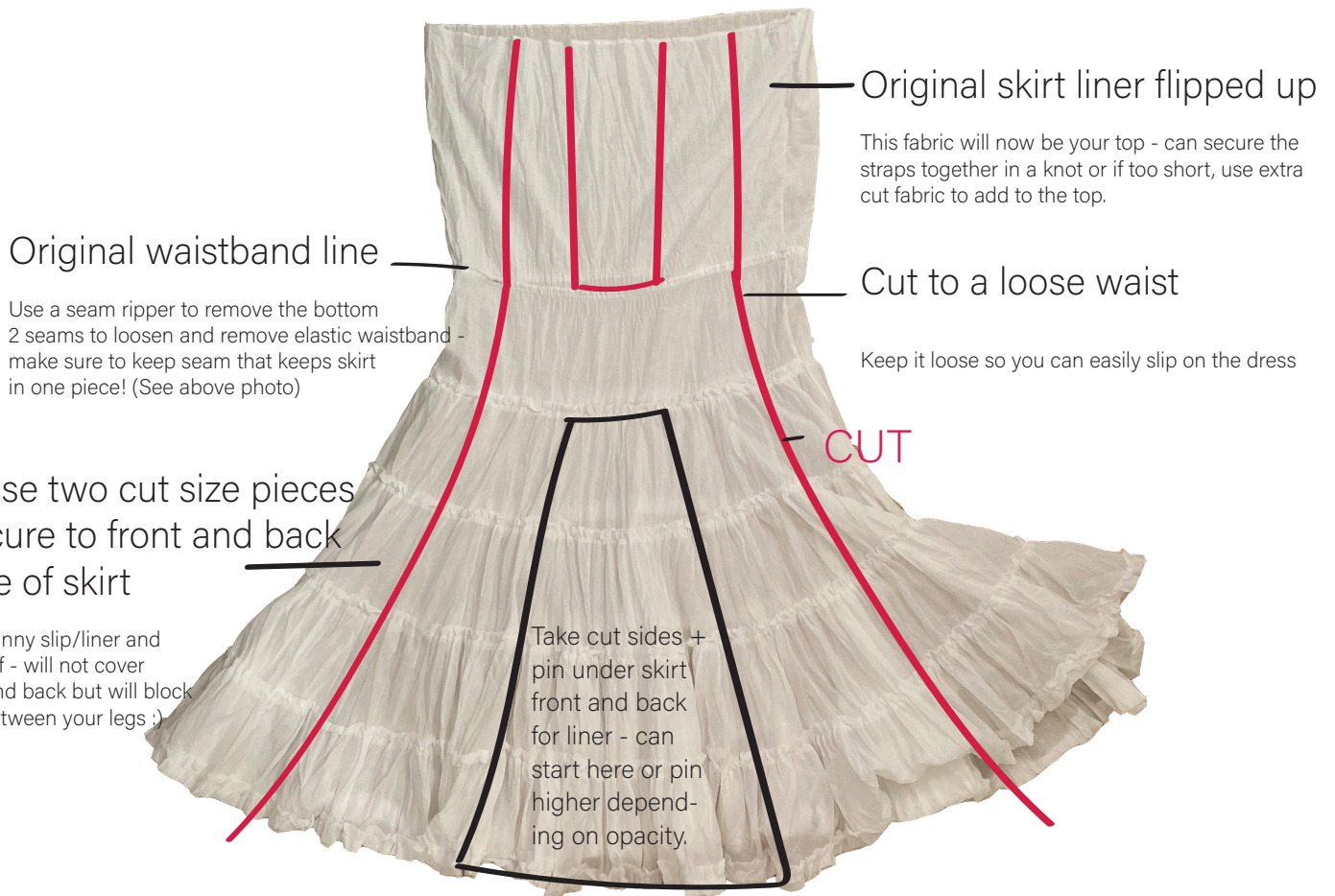


DIY RUFFLE DRESS MADE FROM A BOHO SKIRT



- 1 / Remove bottom two seams to remove the elastic waistband - make sure skirt stays in 1 piece.
- 2 / The skirt liner now flips up and will become the "top" of the dress.
- 3 / Sew in a few inches off sides all the way down the skirt. The top by your rib cage is as loose as you want - you want to be able to put it on without a zipper.
- 4/ Cut the top to whatever shape you want (formerly the skirt liner). I recommend stopping at the horizontal seam (which used to be the top of the original skirt). I did a V in the back. Tie both sides at a top - use extra fabric if necessary to make a big bow, or you can knot it.
- 5 / Cut further down the sides of the top to make the arm pit area more comfortable.
- 6 / I left edges raw, when I tied the edges just curled under and I used non-sew fabric tape to keep it secure. You can sew it for a cleaner look.
- 7/ Take the two large strips you cut off the sides of skirt and pin/sew it under the skirt as a front and back to act as a slip liner (so dress is less see-thru). This acts not only as additional liner but more "fluff" for the dress.



*I do not suggest white since it's almost see-thru, unless you have seen the skirt in person.
